Purpose and Vision:

History is studied by all KS3 students at Globe and is an option at both GCSE and A Level. Studying history encourages students to delve in to past events in order to understand how individuals, government, nations and ideas have fought and co-operated to improve the world around us. Asides from developing knowledge students are encouraged to make decisions after weighing up evidence, contribute in a constructive way to discussions, express themselves clearly and develop their literacy, critical thinking and analysis skills.. History also counts towards the English Baccalaureate (EBacc)

KS3:

History at KS3 is designed to prepare students for the rigors of studying the subject at either GCSE or A level by developing the skills required to succeed at the subject. In addition, KS3 History teaches the students an overview of British History during Year 7 starting with the Vikings and ending with 20th Century Britain. In Year 8, students study a variety of topic relating to World History, including the British Empire, slavery, the First World War, the Second World War and the Holocaust.

KS4:

History at KS4 is taught for three lessons per week, developing both historical understanding and exam skills. The History department is dedicated to engendering a passion for History in the students that take the subject through unpicking the key issues in each of the topics taught and making the subject relevant, regardless of when the event happened. Topics covered at GCSE include Migration, the People and Empire 763-Present Day, America 1920-73, the Cold War and Elizabethan England.

KS5:

History at KS5 prepares students for a variety of destinations; developing analytical skills that can be used in a variety of degrees and careers, encouraging a keen sense of world History that helps develop an awareness of the world around us. History A level students take an active part in the Globe community engaging in debates and discussions preparing them to be leaders in the outside world. Topics studied at A level include Britain 1906-57, Russia 1855-1954 and the Crusades.
