At Ark Globe Primary Academy, we recognise the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of the children. Our Primary School Sport's Funding will enable us to continue and extend our provision through employing an additional sports professional, entering into more competitive sports competitions and training our staff to deliver in-house quality PE sessions.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government provided funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/14 and 2014/15, 2015/16 and 2016/17 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding was jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and saw money going directly to Primary School Headteachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

In 2017 – 2018, each school will receive £16,000 plus an extra £10 per Year 1 – 6 pupil – here at Ark Globe Academy Primary that will mean around £19,490 for the year. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

Purpose of the funding

Schools will have to spend the sport funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses of the funding include:

- Hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work alongside primary teachers when teaching PE
- Paying for professional development opportunities in PE/sport
- Providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE/sport
- Running sport competitions, or increasing participation in the school games
- Buying quality assured professional development modules or material for PE/sport
- Providing places for pupils on after school sport clubs and residential visits

The money must be used so that:

- all children benefit regardless of sporting ability
- that the most-able children are given the opportunity to compete in advanced tournaments
- that staff have access to training opportunities and continued professional development

The Sports funding will be used at Ark Globe Academy Primary to:

- support and engage the least active children through new or additional sports clubs during the school day
- increase the amount of competitive sport in which our children participate – e.g Lambeth and Southwark Football Association
- purchase equipment to offer access to new sports and physical activities as relevant
- provide additional after-school clubs and on a Saturday

Impact:

- We will evaluate the impact of the Sports Premium funding as part of our normal self-evaluation
- We will look at how well we use our Sport Premium to improve the quality and breadth of PE and sporting provision, including increasing participation in PE and sport so that all pupils develop healthy lifestyles and reach the performance levels they are capable of.
- Measuring the impact of the activities provided with sports premium funding can be achieved in different ways. We will look at progress in PE as well as other areas of development such as self-esteem, confidence and the numbers of pupils involved in sporting activities in and out of school.

What we will do	Cost	Impact
Cost towards the purchase and installation of a Container Gym	£15,000	Pupils have not been able to access the Container Gym due to staff turnover and therefore a lack of training opportunities. However, funds were diverted to support from a Secondary PE teacher as well as additional capacity of a Sports Coach for lessons. Pupils therefore received high quality teaching and the Sports coach was able to receive feedback from a specialist teacher. This in turn improved his lessons.
Increase in playground equipment in KS1 and 2 playgrounds	£1500	Additional playground equipment was purchased for the pupils which enhanced lunchtimes and which led to a reduction in lunchtime detentions. Pupils were able to self-regulate far more which ensured a more collaborative approach to teamwork.
Arrange for x2 extra-curricular clubs taught by a Sports Coach	£3120	Pupils accessed a range of extra-curricular clubs taught by a specialist Sports coach. Pupils health and mental well-being increased
