

- Due to coronavirus, normal school life may be disrupted and you will need to use technology for your lessons. This is called **blended learning** as it blends different forms of learning together.
- Since we have returned to school, lessons have taken place in the classroom as normal.
- However, we need to be ready to adapt to different models of education which use technology as well as methods of learning that you are used to.

When will we need to use technology for lessons and learning? What will it involve?

There are 4 different situations where you will using technology for your lessons and learning.

1. SELF-ISOLATING



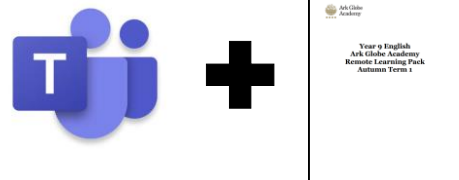
If you have any of the symptoms above you need to stay at home for 10 days.
If someone who lives with you has symptoms, you need to stay at home for 14 days.
The only way of returning to school earlier is if you get a test and that test is negative.

- Whilst self-isolating you should access PowerPoint **lessons on the VLE**.
- You will need to complete work in your folders and complete **home learning** that is set.
- Failure to complete home learning will result in a C2 for each home learning task.
- It may also sometimes be possible for you to join online lessons. You should look at MS Teams and join lessons when invited.

2. LARGE GROUP/YEAR GROUP ISOLATION

If someone in the year group tests positive for coronavirus we may have to send a large number of students home to self-isolate.

- At this point, your **online lesson timetable** will begin.
- In the time outside of online lessons you should complete the **work packs** (which will be on the website).
- Upon return, you will have a mini-assessment or test to review the work you completed at home.

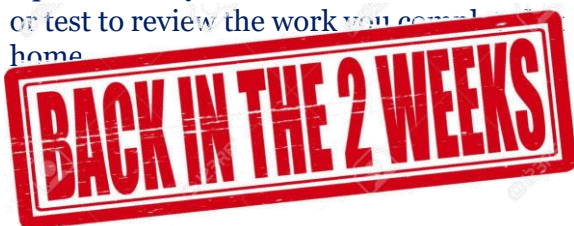


3. PARTIAL LOCKDOWN/ROTA

It may be the case that the government asks us to reduce the amount of people travelling to and from school.

This will lead to a partial lockdown at school where some year group will be learning online from home for 2 weeks and then be at school for 2 weeks.

- Year 11 and Year 13 will always be in school.
- When you are at home, you should follow your **online timetable and complete work packs**.
- Upon return, you will have a mini-assessment or test to review the work you completed at home.



4. FULL LOCKDOWN

It is very unlikely that this will happen. However, in the worst case, all year groups will have to stay at home until the government says we can return.

- At this point, the **online lesson timetable** will begin.
- In the time outside of online lessons you should complete the **work packs** (which will be on the website).
- You will have an online test or assessment at the end of each 2 week block and the results will be sent to parents.
